

We are always very impressed with our pupil's behaviour in High standards lessons and when representing school at tournaments etc. However we would appreciate your support in reminding your children that all adults, including lunchtime staff and club leaders deserve the same high standard of respect, manners and behaviour, in keeping with our value of belonging.

We would also appreciate your **support** in encouraging pupils to adhere to the uniform policy. This includes no jewellery, hair ornaments, make-up and nail varnish. For many reasons, primarily **safety**, we do not allow jewellery, other than studs in pierced ears and a watch but not a smart watch or religious items. Pupils are required to remove watches and studs, or in the case of studs that cannot be removed, to tape them over during P.E. lessons to prevent them from causing injury. Hair bands, ribbons/bows should not have large flowers or other decoration attached.

Pupils are required to wear plain black shoes without logos. In the winter, ankle boots may be worn, these should also be plain black and without a high heel. For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear shoes with open toes, platform soles or high heels. Trainers can only be worn for PE. Pegasus we have been hot seating characters from our Wolf Wilder story, calculating with fractions, using vector graphics software and learning more about Inuit art.




